The Metaverse is a term used to describe a virtual shared space, created by the convergence of virtually enhanced physical reality and physically persistent virtual space. The word "metaverse" is a portmanteau of the prefix "meta" (meaning "beyond") and the word "universe".

The Metaverse will be an open-ended, persistent, shared virtual world. It could be considered as an extension of planet Earth or cyberspace. In this sense, it is similar to other proposed concepts such as Cyberspace 2.0 or Global Brain 2.0.

The Metaverse is a term coined by Neal Stephenson in his 1992 science fiction novel Snow Crash. It's a virtual reality environment that's created by the collective efforts of people connected to the internet

The Metaverse is not just limited to VR or AR. It can also be accessed through any form of digital medium such as text, sound, or video. The key difference between the metaverse and the internet is that it's persistent and shared among many users.

The future of the Metaverse is not set in stone but there are a few possibilities. One possibility is that it will become a virtual reality that people can explore and interact with. Another possibility is that it will be an augmented reality where people can view and interact with real objects.

The Metaverse has been designed to be an open system in which all users are free to create their own virtual world or social network. The system will allow for the integration of real-world data into its blockchain, which will provide users with a more realistic experience.




SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOALS



Seventy-eight percent of marine mammals are at risk of accidental deaths, such as getting caught in fishing nets. Plastic bags and other plastic garbage that ends up in the ocean kill over 1,000,000 sea animals every year.

The combined weight of ants on the planet is higher than all human beings. The world has over 7 billion people, and 100 trillion ants.

4. A glass bottle can take up to 1 million years to decompose.

Glass takes a very, very long time to break down. It can take a glass bottle more than a million years to decompose in the environment, possibly even more if it's in a landfill. This means that glass manufactured and used 5000 years ago may still be present in the environment. Because its life cycle is so long, and because glass doesn't leach any chemicals, it's better to repurpose and reuse it over and over again before recycling it.
