Hailing from the Sonbhadra district in Uttar Pradesh, Ram Baboo is the only son of a manual labourer and a homemaker. He grew up with three sisters, and the family's meager income, fluctuating between Rs 3,000 to Rs 3,500, made it challenging to make ends meet. Baboo embraced a life of balancing various odd jobs in his pursuit of sporting excellence. To fund his sports training, he worked as a waiter and even engaged in labour under the MGNREGA scheme during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Wangari Maathai was a Kenyan environmental and political activist and the first African woman to win the Nobel Peace Prize. She fought to protect the environment and promote democracy in her country while also advocating



for women's rights. She demonstrated resilience by standing up to powerful forces and refusing to back down in the face of adversity.

These and other stories inspire us to rise like a Phoenix bird in the wake of adversity and become resilient. As the saying goes, "*When the going gets tough, the tough get going*".

Year-end is a good time to look back at what unfolded during the year. Think of what you did and how you did it, and reflect on how you could have done better and rise like a Phoenix bird because you are strong and resilient.

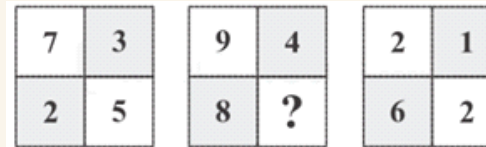

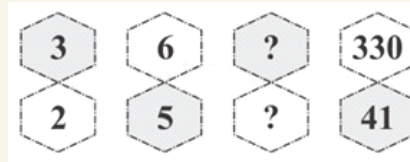

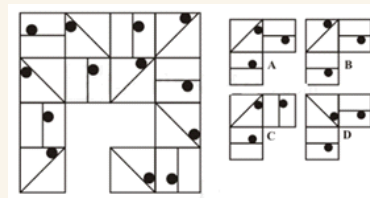

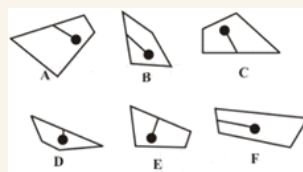

FACTS ABOUT WORLD WAR II 'THE NIGHT FIGHTERS'

When England's small, but gallant, force of Hurricanes and Spitfires made daylight bomber attacks too costly, the Luftwaffe turned to night raids. To counter this, the RAF employed hastily modified Bouton-Paul Defiant aircraft to fly at night.

▶ When WW2 began the RAF did not have specialist night fighters. The Defiant, a two-man Bomber with a power – operated four – gun turret, was too slow for daytime fighting in 1940 – 41, but more successful at night.

▶ At first, the RAF pilots, flying at night only had their eyes to guide them, they looked for glowing exhausts of the engine of enemy aircraft.

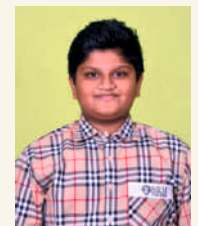
▶ One un-successful idea was to use two planes, one with a light to find the enemy and the other to shoot down the enemy.

▶ The 'beaufactors' first victory was using the 'new A1 Mark VI radar', on 19 November 1940, a pilot shot down a German JU-88 Bomber over Oxford.

▶ Most night-fighters had 2 'man crews', one to handle radar and navigation, and the other to pilot the plane and fire guns at enemy aircraft.

▶ The RAF's most famous night-fighter was 'John Cunningham'. The press nicknamed him as 'Cat's eyes', because cats have excellent night-vision.

▶ By January 1941, British defenses were bringing down one German Bomber in 100- a success rate three times better than when the blitz started.

NOCTURNAL ANIMALS

Why are some animals nocturnal?

There are various theories for how animals became nocturnal, but evolutionary biology is the most widely accepted theory. Millions of years ago when the ancestors of modern-day mammals lived and evolved, they developed nocturnal characteristics to evade diurnal (active during the day) predators. Becoming active at night, when their predators were sleeping, allowed certain species to survive and continue to pass on these nocturnal characteristics to the various nocturnal animals in the world today.

The Advantages of Being a Nocturnal Animal

Many animals hunt the same prey, for example, birds such as owls or hawks. However, as hawks are diurnal and owls nocturnal, there is reduced competition for food as the hawk hunts during the day and the owl at night. This allows for the continuation of the species as there is no need for conflict between the two.

Successful hunting is another benefit of nocturnality for predatory animals. Take lions, for example, their prey consists of zebras and antelope. 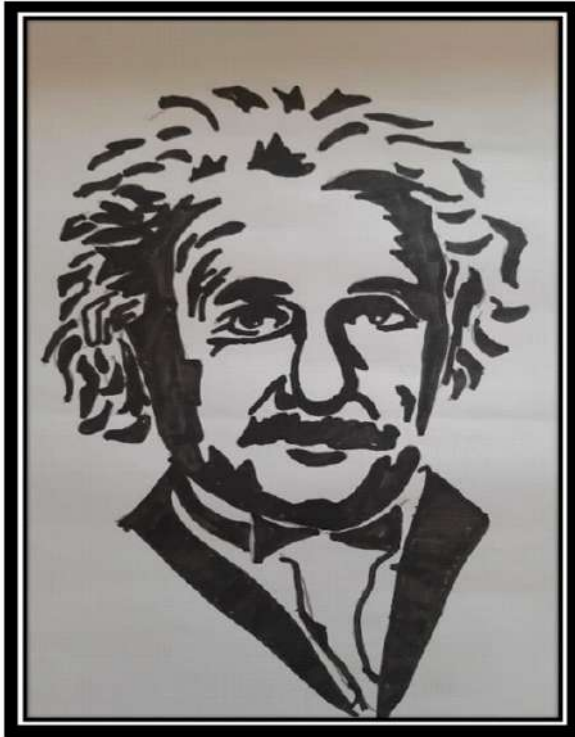

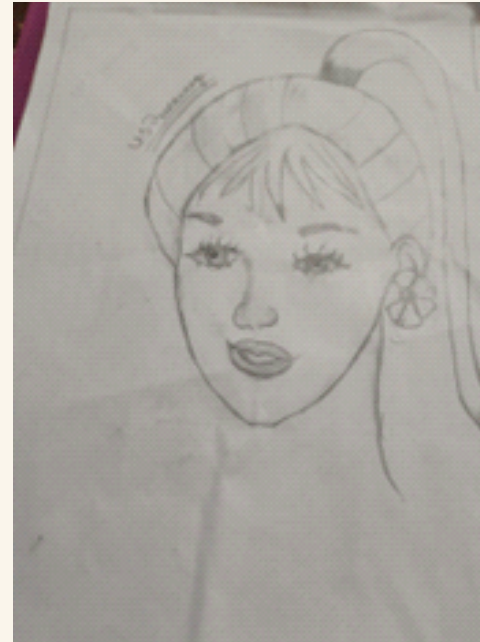
